FAQ's

A few questions have recently been asked by residents regarding the canal works in East Wichel and future plans in the area:

Q1) What are the plans for the fields between Middle and East Wichel?

This area will be a combination of sports and play facilities along with a pavilion. Keep you eyes out for more details on the plans later this year!

Q2) The canal level is dropping again near the aquaduct. Are you aware and what are the plans for removing the bunds?



The sensors in the canal provide readings which are checked daily so accurate data is being collected. Whilst the high levels of rainfall over the last year have kept the canal topped up, the team have been waiting for some dry weather to check how each section performs before the bunds are removed. One half of the aquaduct section does still have a small issue so the water level will be left to fall and depending when it stops dropping this will help indicate where the leak is allowing options to be explored.
