

Newsletter April 2025



Work is now well underway on the new housing parcels in Wichel Fields and Canalside with the first new homes coming out of the ground. The McCarthy Stone and Anchor apartment blocks are also well progressed and the first crane has been removed.

As we enter the warmer months the canal and earthworks activity is also restarting. These works have needed to be paused over the winter as the ground is too wet but the recent warm sunny weather means it is now possible to start again in earnest.

Detailed design is also underway for the road which will replace the construction haul road and connect the District Centre stretch of Peglars Way with Mill Lane roundabout.

Over in the Orchards, the archaeological investigation is now complete, and work will start shortly preparing the land for the next phases of both Orchards Rise and Orchards View. Construction of the roundabout which links Scott Way to the road under the M4 is also continuing.









Wichelstowe includes large areas of green space which provide both habitats for a range of different wildlife species and footpaths for residents to enjoy.
